**SCHOLARSHIP
POLICY**

2018-2019

The DSMA will award scholarships to Dartmouth High School Senior Students that have met the following criteria:

1. The student must be attending a school of continuing education within twelve months of being awarded the scholarship
2. Membership must have existed for three years, one of which is the student's senior year; and must have been renewed before October 31, 2017
3. Student must participate in the annual ad book either for the Fall Home Show or Pops Concert three of the four years
4. Gillette participation is required by the student or designee their Junior and Senior years

Any student who is part of the music program as a senior and has special circumstances, such as a transfer student, must be approved by the Director of Music in order to be classified as eligible.

Senior students that meet the criteria listed above will be mailed an application. If a senior feels they are eligible and have not received an application, they must inquire with the Scholarship Chairperson as to whether or not they are eligible.

The following will be expected from all scholarship applicants in addition to the above:

1. Completed application submitted by the deadline, **no exceptions**
2. A letter of recommendation from a Music Instructor
3. A letter of recommendation from one other instructor at Dartmouth High School outside of the Music Department

Scholarship awards will start with a base rate and increase according to how the following criteria is met:

- Gillette participation Freshman & Sophomore years
- Participation in two music/guard activities per year

- Music recommendation score 40-50 points
- Academic recommendation score 30-40 points

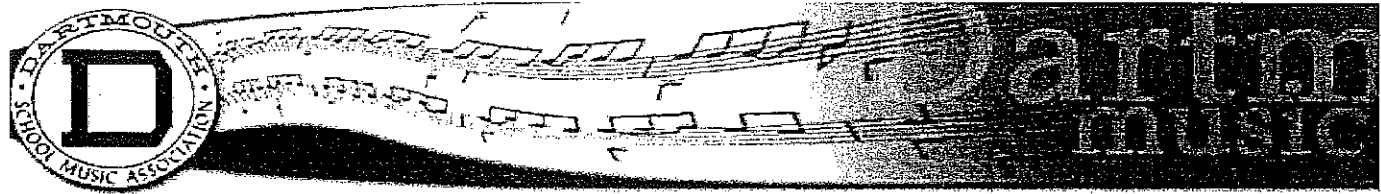
The Director of Music and instructors of the performing groups will present their recommendations to the Scholarship Committee in reference to the applicant's contribution, participation and attitude; plans for further music study; active participation in DSMA activities; and academic record.

The Scholarship Committee will determine the amount of each scholarship awarded based on total funds raised as well as the number of students eligible to participate. (see DSMA by-laws)

Scholarship recipients have twelve (12) months from the date of notification that you received a scholarship to request that scholarship from the DSMA, no exceptions! The DSMA Treasurer must be presented with a receipted bill showing a tuition payment to the school of higher education. Once received, the Scholarship Award will be mailed to the student.

Scholarship Fund raising – We encourage all students to participate in earning the funds necessary to keep DSMA functioning. These include but are not limited to: Gillette, ad book, breakfasts/suppers, candy bars, wreaths, poinsettias and any other type of money-making ideas DSMA can come up with! (New ideas are always welcome). Proceeds from these types of fundraisers go directly into the DSMA operating account with the exception of the ad book. It is the one fundraiser to directly benefit the DSMA Scholarship Fund. The ad book showcases many local businesses in a booklet that is printed and distributed at two large events per year.

These Scholarship Policies are periodically reviewed and/or changed. If there are any questions in regards to these policies, please direct them to either the Scholarship Committee Chair(s), President of the DSMA or the Director of Music at Dartmouth High School.

FUND RAISING AND ASSESSMENTS

The **DSMA** exists to promote and enhance the various music programs in the Dartmouth Public School System. We also believe that these enhanced musical and performance opportunities should be available to every student that wishes to participate, regardless of a family's ability to pay – this is the reason that there is *no* entry fee to join the Indoor or Color Guard programs – unlike many other school districts that do charge a participation fee. To provide the level of support that the **DSMA** does requires us to raise a significant amount of money every single year. The amount varies from year to year but is generally about \$100,000 each year. The money raised goes into several funds under DSMA's control, namely:

- General or operating account
- Scholarship Account
- Reserve Account

Some other funds raised go into the Music Department budget to be dispersed under the direction of the Music Director, one of these fund raisers is the football season concession stand and another are the seasonal concerts each year.

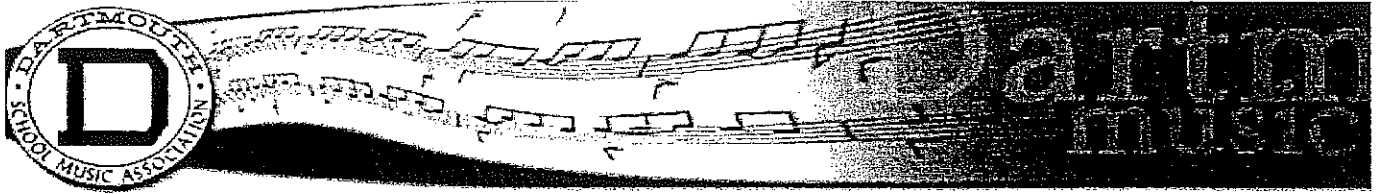
There are several ways the DSMA raises funds each year including the following:

- Concession Stand at home football games
- Gillette Stadium Concession Stand
- Home Competition Shows
- Pop's Concert and all Holiday/Spring Concerts
- Various fund-raising events determined by the Board for each year, i.e. advertisement books, yard sales, car washes, candy bar sales, dine-out, baby-sitting, lottery tree, 50/50 ticket sales etc...

The number and type of events is largely determined by the anticipated need each year and the capacity of the volunteers to pull off each event successfully.

The Board of the DSMA determines how the funds raised will be allotted. For example, Ad Book sales are directed specifically to the Scholarship Fund, while other funds may be allotted to the general/operating account to cover expenses or the reserve account to cover unanticipated or maintenance expenses generally related to the maintenance and operation of DSMA's tractor trailer truck and other vehicles used throughout the year for the program.

Some of these fund raisers will have a student assessment attached to them. The assessment is an amount of money generated by the student during an event that goes into that student's own account held by the DSMA. That money is used by the student to offset the costs generally associated with championship travel events such as MetLife and/or Darton, or 2016's trip to Disney World. The ability of the DSMA to offer assessments for fund raisers will vary.

WHERE THE MONEY GOES

Each year the DSMA raises about \$100,000 to support the music and performance programs in the Dartmouth Public School system. We raise this money through various fund raising events and programs held throughout the year. The DSMA is a 501 3c Certified Non-Profit Organization and all contributions are fully tax deductible. The money raised goes directly back to the students that participate in the various music programs offered in the District and has helped make Dartmouth known across the country as one of the most talented and successful music programs year after year for over twenty five years!

Where does the money raised go? We offer the following general breakdown as an illustration of how the money is spent. A full, line-item budget is available upon request that itemizes all income and disbursements for each year.

Scholarships \$ 8,000 - \$10,000 Yearly
The DSMA awards scholarships to deserving high school seniors each year to be used to further their education in college

Marching Band/Indoor and Color Guard Programs \$ 60,000 - \$70,000 Yearly
Includes Music rights, props, equipment, staff stipends, vehicle rentals, plane fares, entry fees, trophies, food, water, snacks, costumes/materials etc.

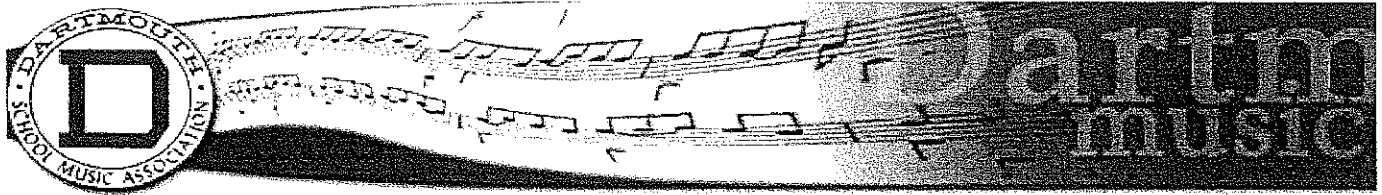
Vehicle Maintenance/rentals \$ 10,000 - \$15,000 Yearly
The DSMA owns and maintains an 18 wheel tractor trailer that is used to transport instruments and props to and from regional competitions. It also rents a tractor for longer distance shows such as Connecticut and the championships in New Jersey and Dayton Ohio. The DSMA also rents a box type truck to transport instruments to and from parades and the color guard props to and from performances.

Miscellaneous Expenses \$ 3,000 - 5,000 Yearly
Insurance, web site host fees, custodial cafeteria fees, financial assistance to students

These monies are all raised through the efforts of the DSMA, its dedicated students, their families and our volunteers and does not come from within the Dartmouth Public School Budget. The money raised allows Dartmouth to offer a top caliber music and performance opportunity to all Dartmouth students without any application fees regardless of a family's ability to pay. Your continued support will help the DSMA continue Dartmouth's tradition of nationally recognized musical performance for years to come. Thank you for your support!

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES WITHIN THE DSMA

The DSMA relies heavily on volunteers within the Dartmouth community. From the all-volunteer Executive Board of Directors to the grandmother of a student who helps raffle 50/50 tickets at a home show the DSMA could not exist without a large group of *enthusiastic* volunteers. The old adage that ‘many hands make for light work’ rings true for the DSMA and their efforts to support the music and performance programs within the Dartmouth public school system. There are many opportunities to help throughout the year, many require only a small commitment of time and all provide an opportunity to meet friendly, like-minded people with a keen interest in music and performance art in Dartmouth.

Some of the volunteer opportunities include:

Chaperones

Throughout the year the DSMA needs adult chaperones to travel with the band/guard to shows throughout the region. The vast majority of these shows are on a Saturday and/or a Sunday and may require travel on a school bus or in your own car to a regional show depending on the number of students and the bus capacity. The chaperone manages the students on their bus during the travel time as well as assists during the day to keep their group together and focused on the events of the day. Chaperones are expected to stay with their group of students throughout the event and will be given a list of students, their parental contacts and a medical bag containing basic first aid items should they be needed. First time chaperones will be accompanied by an experienced chaperone to get them acquainted with the requirements of chaperoning.

In addition to these short-term chaperone opportunities there are several, longer events such as the MetLife and Dayton trips that require multi-night stays out of town. Chaperones for these events might be able to travel on a coach bus with their students and stay in the same hotel as the student group, again depending on group size and bus capacity. Chaperones will have contact information for all student’s parents/guardians and emergency medications for individual students if required. These chaperones will also be required to monitor hallways at night on a rotating schedule with other chaperones. Given the additional requirements that these opportunities entail, lodging and meal costs may be waived. The DSMA reserves the right to select these chaperones based on their previous experience chaperoning other events and participation in other volunteer opportunities throughout the year.
